SUBJECT: Elkhorn River Stabilization Project (01-03-547-4400)

Account Over 110%

Following the flooding in March 2019, inspection of the Elkhorn River along the section of the Improvement Project Area (IPA) showed the need for bank stabilization and reconstruction work. This work was budgeted in FY 2020 to be contracted, with an expected cost to the District of \$50,000 for Professional Services in design and construction administration, and \$250,000 in Contract Work for construction services. This work is included in the FEMA flood recovery project list, and reimbursement is expected to cover 75% of costs incurred.

Five (5) sites were identified, design was completed, and a contract was awarded to Niewohner Construction in the amount of \$850,696. This amount was higher than the original estimate in the FY 2020 budget. Changing site conditions, tight bidding market, and increased material costs due to extremely high demand were all a factor in the elevated contract price. As the contracted work was being completed, the need for additional rock stabilization was identified and recommended by the engineer for the project. Quantities for rock placed are known to be higher than the bid amount. Work has now been completed on all sites, and invoices have been submitted for both the professional services and construction work.

The total cost for this repair work exceeds the current balance of funds collected by the IPA through its annual assessment, so the contractor will need to be paid from the general fund pending receipt of FEMA reimbursement. A request will be submitted to FEMA using the documentation of the completed project, and it is hoped but not certain that reimbursement will be received prior to the end of the fiscal year. When sufficient assessments have been collected, the IPA will reimburse the general fund for the local share, so that all District costs will be covered by the IPA as originally planned.

The general fund accounts under project 547, Elkhorn River Stabilization, do not have sufficient budget this fiscal year to cover the IPA repair costs. Projects which are currently included in the FY 2020 budget but which are not expected to be fully expended before the end of the fiscal year have been identified. This includes Western Douglas County Trail under 01-06-261-4410, Papio Trails System – Construction Costs, which is expected to make up the difference between the IPA budget amount and the total cost of this work.

Staff recommends that the Subcommittee recommend to the Board that the
account for Elkhorn River Stabilization (01-03-547-4400) be allowed to exceed the
budgeted amount by up to \$940,000.

ARTICLE 6 – TIME OF COMPLETION

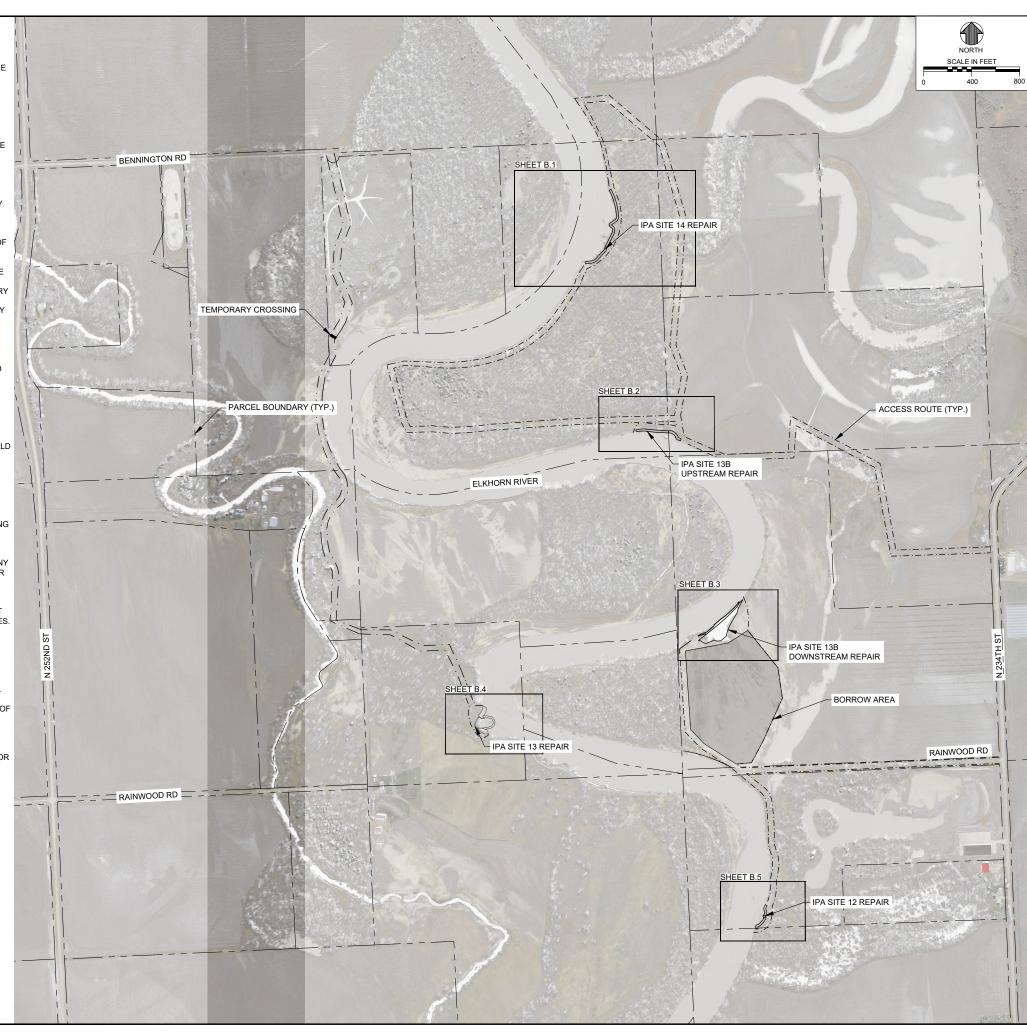
- 6.1 Bidder agrees that the Work will be substantially complete and will be completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before the dates or within the number of calendar days indicated in the Agreement.
- 6.2 Bidder accepts the provisions of the Agreement as to liquidated damages.

ARTICLE 7 – ATTACHMENTS TO THIS BID

GENERAL CONDITION NOTES:

- THE LOCATION OF ALL ABOVE GROUND AND UNDERGROUND UTILITY FACILITIES ARE APPROXIMATE OR MAY NOT BE INDICATED IN THESE PLANS. UNDERGROUND FACILITIES, WHETHER INDICATED OR NOT, SHALL BE LOCATED AND FLAGGED BY THE CONTRACTOR. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE REQUIRED TO NOTIFY AND COORDINATE ALL NECESSARY UTILITY SERVICE INTERRUPTIONS WITH THE OWNERS. ANY DAMAGE TO EXISTING UTILITIES AND/OR PAVED STREETS CAUSED BY CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS SHALL BE REPAIRED AT THE CONTRACTOR'S EXPENSE.
- 2. ONE CALL: 402-344-3565
- 3. A NEST SURVEY MUST BE CONDUCTED 5 DAYS PRIOR TO ANY CLEARING AND GRUBBING BETWEEN THE MONTHS OF FEBRUARY THROUGH SEPTEMBER. THE ENGINEER'S FIELD REPRESENTATIVE MUST BE CONTACTED 10 DAYS PRIOR TO DISTURBANCE TO ARRANGE THE SURVEY. CLEARING AND GRUBBING CANNOT BEGIN UNTIL APPROVAL BY THE FIELD REPRESENTATIVE. IF THE DISTURBANCE DOES NOT START WITHIN 5 DAYS OF THE SURVEY, THEN A NEW SURVEY WILL BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO THE START OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES
- 4. CONTRACT MUST ADHERE TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE NATIONWIDE 404 PERMIT GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS FOR THIS PROJECT. A COPY OF THE REQUIREMENTS WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE SELECTED CONTRACTOR, OR UPON REQUEST.
- 5. ALL RUBBLE AND DEBRIS FROM CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES MUST BE REMOVED FORM THE SITE UPON COMPLETION OF WORK. ALL DISTURBED AREAS WITHIN THE APPROVED LIMITS OF CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE RESTORED TO ORIGINAL CONDITIONS BY DISKING OR ROTO-TILLING COMPACTED SOILS PRIOR TO FINISHED GRADING AND SEEDING.
- 6. TREES 6" DIA. AND GREATER ARE IDENTIFIED ON PLANS. SMALLER DIAMETER TREES MAY BE ENCOUNTERED WITHIN CLEARING AND GRUBBING AREAS.
- 7. CLEARING AND GRUBBING TO BE PERFORMED ONLY IN LOCATIONS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY TO CONSTRUCT AND ACCESS THE SITE FEATURES. MAXIMUM ACCEPTABLE DISTANCE AT EACH FIELD SITE FROM THE TOP OF BANK TO CLEAR AND GRUB IS 30 FEET. TREES DIRECTLY ON THE BANKLINE SHOULD NOT BE REMOVED, UNLESS APPROVED BY FIELD REPRESENTATIVE.
- 8. STABILIZED ROCK ENTRANCES MUST PLACE AT LOCATIONS WHERE EQUIPMENT ACCESSES PUBLIC ROADS. EACH SHALL BE MAINTAINED AT ALL TIMES TO ENSURE SEDIMENT IS NOT TRACKED ONTO PUBLIC STREET AREAS. CONTRACTOR MAY BE REQUIRED TO PLACE MORE ROCK TO AREAS OR CLEAN SEDIMENT FROM EXISTING ROCK. IF ANY SEDIMENT IS TRACKED ON PUBLIC STREET AREAS, THE CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR REMOVING THE SEDIMENT IMMEDIATELY. THIS ITEM WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. - 9. ELECTRONIC FILES FOR GPS EQUIPMENT OR STAKING DATA POINT CAN BE PROVIDED BY ENGINEER UPON REQUEST BY CONTRACTOR.
- 10. PROPERTY BOUNDARIES REFLECT TAX RECORDS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY AS OF 2019.
- 11. BANKLINE AND EXISTING ROCK LOCATIONS REPRESENT DATA COLLECTED MARCH 2019. FIELD CONDITIONS MAY HAVE CHANGED THAT WILL REQUIRE MEDICATIONS TO THE DESIGN PER ENGINEER'S GUIDANCE.
- 12. CONTRACTOR IS TO REPLACE ANY EXISTING FENCE REMOVED FOR SITE ACCESS UPON COMPLETION OF WORK IN THAT AREA AS PART OF MOBILIZATION.
- 13. CONTRACTOR REQUIRED TO CONTROL TRACKOUT FROM ACCESS POINTS ONTO PUBLIC ROADS AND REMOVE ANY ACCUMULATED SEDIMENT ON ROADWAYS AS A RESULT OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES.
- 14. CONSTRUCT TEMPORARY CROSSING OVER DRAINAGE CHANNEL AT THE ELKHORN CROSSING RECREATION SITE. CONTRACTOR TO PROVIDE BORROW MATERIAL FOR ANY EMBANKMENT NEEDED FOR THE CROSSING AS WELL AS ANY TEMPORARY PIPES OR MATERIALS TO ACCOMMODATE DRAINAGE.
- CONTRACTOR TO ABIDE BY ACCESS ROUTES AND LIMITS OF CONSTRUCTION AS SHOWN. ANY
 MODIFICATIONS TO ACCESS ROUTES TO BE SUBMITTED AND APPROVED BY FIELD ENGINEER
 PRIOR TO ACCESS.
- 16. ALL AREA DISTURBED FOR CONSTRUCTION AND ACCESS TO BE RETURNED TO PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONDITIONS. SITES THAT WERE PREVIOUSLY VEGETATED TO BE RESEEDED WITH THE PASTURE SEED MIX. THE RESEEDING AREA FOR THE ENTIRE PROJECT LOCATED WITHIN THE DESIGNATED LIMITS OF CONSTRUCTION WAS ESTIMATED AS 3.7 ACRES. CONTRACTOR TO ONLY BE REIMBURSED FOR AREA RESEEDED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF CONSTRUCTION UNLESS APPROVED BY FIELD ENGINEER PRIOR TO ANY DISTURBANCE OUTSIDE THE LIMITS OF CONSTRUCTION.
- 17. THE OWNER HAS APPLIED FOR A REGIONAL GENERAL 404 PERMIT TO THE UNITED STATES CORPS OF ENGINEERS FOR THE WORK TO BE PERFORMED AT IPA SITE 13 AND THE TEMPORARY CROSSING TO ACCESS THIS SITE. THE PERMIT IS PENDING AND WORK ASSOCIATED WITH THIS SITE SHOULD NOT BE PERFORMED UNTIL THE PERMIT IS OBTAINED. CONTRACTOR TO SEQUENCE WORK ACCORDINGLY.
- THE OWNER HAS APPLIED FOR AN NPDES PERMIT THROUGH THE NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND ENERGY FOR THE ENTIRE WORK SITE. THE PERMIT IS PENDING BUT IS ANTICIPATED TO BE AWARDED PRIOR TO NOTICE TO PROCEED. CONTRUCTION CANNOT BEGIN UNTIL THIS PERMIT IS OBTAINED.
 A COPY OF THE PERMITS WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE CONTRACTOR ONCE AWARDED. THE
- 19. A COPY OF THE PERMITS WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE CONTRACTOR ONCE AWARDED. THE CONTRACTOR MUST ABIDE BY ALL PEMRIT REQUIREMENTS. ANY IMPACTS TO QUANTITIES OR TIMELINES WILL BE ADJUSTED BY CHANGE ORDER.

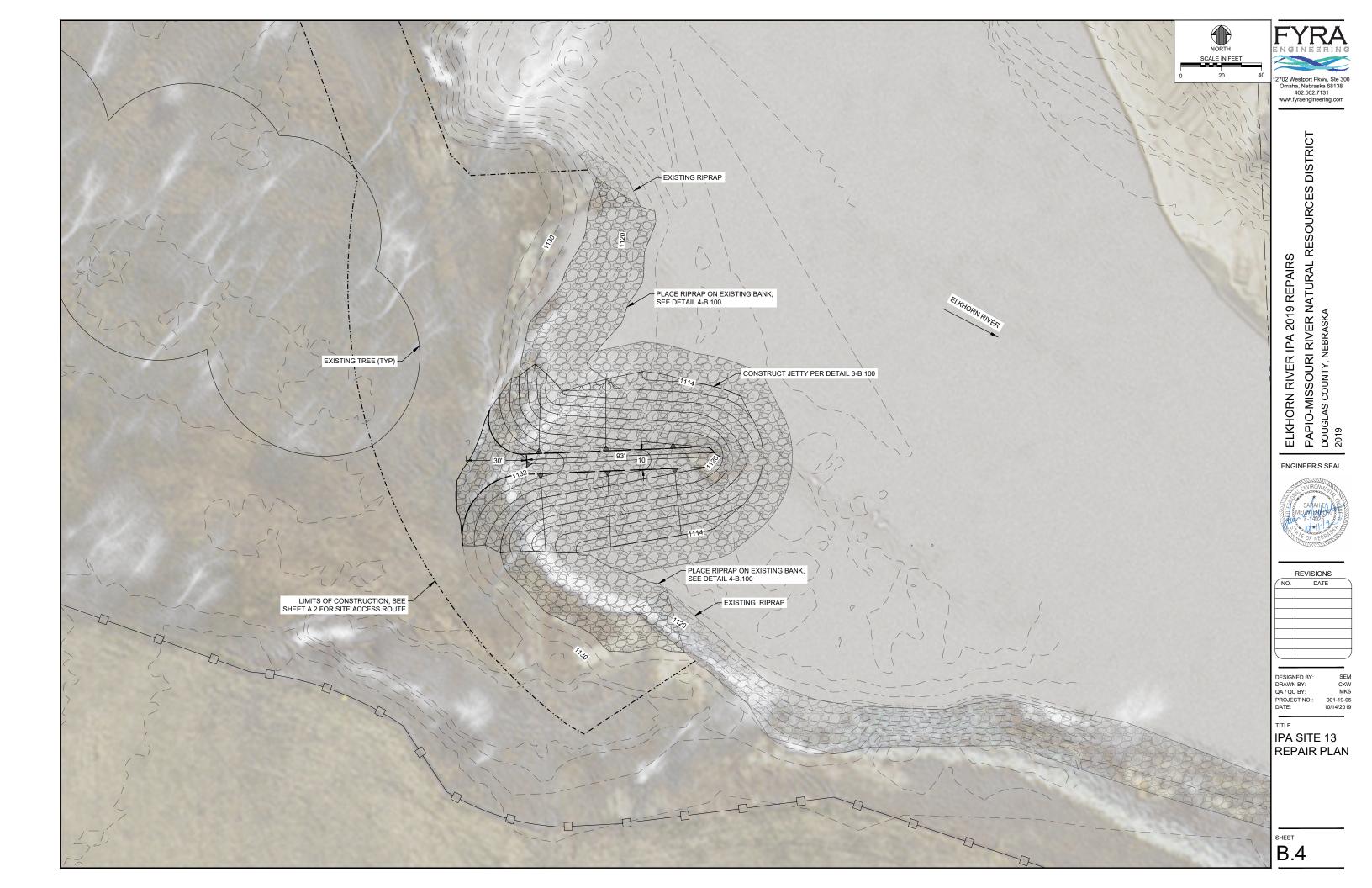
