1. Introductions

 An agenda and handouts were distributed. Marlin Petermann (P-MRNRD) facilitated introductions.

2. MS4 Stormwater Management Plan Document Update

- Lori Laster explained that the annual report for the MS4 permits would be due on April 1, 2020. Along with the annual report, several documents will need to be submitted to NDEE to satisfy the Permit Year 1 requirements.
- One item specifically is an enforcement procedure for violations to rules adopted for the permit. Not all jurisdictions have the same enforcement procedures. A key purpose of the Partnership is to have consistency across all jurisdictions.
- A draft policy will be presented at the February 27, 2020 Partnership Meeting.

3. Draft Scope of Work - Future Stream Degradation Analysis

- At the October 2019 Partnership Meeting, Sarpy County stated their intent to update their stream setback policy. Several developments have had issues with stream stability and the current setback policy has not been sufficient for addressing those issues.
- Lori Laster presented a draft request for proposals to have a consultant look at the current setback policy, assumed future degradation of streams in undeveloped areas of the watershed, and potential improvements to the policy.
- Art Beccard stated that FYRA Engineering had been hired by Sarpy County to clarify the current setback policy and develop a standard method of calculating the setback distance.
- Marlin Petermann stated that because this project is anticipated to be a small contract and under the P-MRNRD management approval threshold, consultants will be directly asked to prepare a proposal rather than advertise and select through interviews.
- Proposals will be presented at the February 27, 2020 meeting.
