RE: FY 2021 Equipment Requirements

Attached is a chart of equipment items identified for purchase/replacement in FY 2021. The process to identify and prioritize equipment items most needed by the District was determined by a staff Equipment Committee comprised of Bill Brush, Martin Cleveland, Zach Nelson, Bill Warren, Terry Schumacher and myself. Each department within the NRD identified their equipment requirements and the Equipment Committee reviewed each item and made recommendations to the General Manager for purchase. The GM then reviewed the Committee's recommendations and made further changes to the request list.

The FY 2020 total equipment budget was \$327,236. The FY 2021 equipment budget request is \$386,704.06.

Management recommends that the Subcommittee recommend to the Board of Directors to approve the FY 2021 Equipment Requirements subject to the FY 2021 Budget as listed in this memo.

RE: Name Brand Request "Caterpillar" Rubber Tire Loader

I am requesting a name brand State Contract Caterpillar 938 M Rubber Tire Loader. Staff and management believe it is in the best interest of the District to purchase the brand of Caterpillar Rubber Tire Loader for the following reasons:

- 1. The District currently owns several pieces of Caterpillar heavy equipment. This equipment has performed outstandingly with minimal maintenance.
- 2. All components of said equipment are Caterpillar parts, which is essential for sound operation and performance.
- 3. The Caterpillar equipment seems to perform best with the terrain in which the equipment is used. Just as with the John Deere tractors and Mack truck that the Board has approved name branding in the past, the Caterpillar equipment operates most efficiently and safely in our field conditions.
- 4. The District has used other heavy equipment brands in the past and incurred excessive maintenance and repair cost in everyday use.
- 5. Douglas County and the City of Omaha use the Nebraska State Contract from Caterpillar.

I recommend a name brand purchase of a 2021 Caterpillar Tire Loader to replace our current 2005 Case 621-D Tire Loader which will be traded in.
