A. INFORMATION/EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS:

The I&E Department completed its "Would You Rather?" campaign to increase awareness of and obtain public feedback on our Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. The campaign was a huge success, with 700 District residents completing the online survey. This compared to 7 completed surveys by the public in 2016. This community-based feedback helps us better develop a plan to save lives and property from hazards, as well as keep our communities eligible for federal assistance in case of a disaster.

B. PERSONNEL/MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS:

- 1. FYRA has provided an update on the contracted fee for the Big Papio Levee Culverts Project Phase 2 that outlines scope items that have changed since the start of the original contract. The additional services total \$6,950.82 and are estimated to take two months to complete. The invoice is attached.
- **2.** The District has hired Kyle Madsen as the Papillion Creek Watershed Coordinator. This is a 3-year 319 grant funded position. Kyle's first day with the District was Thursday, August 27th.
- **3.** The District has also hired William Benda as our Land Steward. William's first day with the District was Tuesday, September 1st.
- **4.** Teresa Murphy, Program Assistant in the Thurston County Field Office, has informed me that she plans to retire from her position on September 30, 2020. Teresa started with the District in 1989. I want to thank her for her many years of service. She will be missed by all.
- **5.** Congratulations to Director Sopinski for receiving the "Environment Champion" award from Green Bellevue. The Green Bellevue Board says Director Sopinski's "dedicated efforts to improve our community and world environment through your help in presenting at our monthly program has been noticed and appreciated." - **C. Dear Mr. Winkler.

This letter is an update to the contracted fee for the above referenced contract with FYRA Engineering and offers an opportunity to document scope items that have changed since the start of the original contract. Submitted for the September board meeting is an invoice that takes the project through 21 August 2020.

The contract total for this project is \$360,085.00 which includes project management, preliminary design, permitting (408 and 404), final design, bidding, and construction. To date there have been no amendments to this contract.

Since the execution of this contract, a number of services have been provided outside of the initial scope of the contract. The majority of the additional services can be attributed to the following items:

- Adding another penetration/culvert (BP-L30) to the project.
- 2019 prolonged high water in the Big Papillion Creek which lead to sloughing of channel banks and additional degradation to culverts since the original design.
- Contractor delay of several weeks due to an unmarked communication line adding several weeks to the construction timeline.

An expanded list of additional services is attached to this letter. All of these items are outside the scope of the original contracted work. At the time of the issuance of the latest invoice (21 August 2020) the total effort on these additional services totals \$6,950.82. The contractor has rehabilitation remaining on two penetrations at one site (BP-L15A&B) to complete the project and it is estimated that this will take the contractor approximately 2 months to complete this work. The average monthly invoice on this project has been about \$15,000 per month so it is estimated that an additional \$30,000 of work on this project may occur.

FYRA appreciates the opportunity to serve your NRD on these penetration rehabilitation projects. Please feel free to contact me with any questions you may have.
