I have a brief report this month, since we have been super busy completing CRP contracts before our Friday, September 11 deadline. We are near the finish line planning and writing around 148 CRP contracts to establish and enhance over 3,000 acres of wildlife habitat and water quality buffers throughout the NRD.

As I mentioned last month we have completed our contracting phase of EQIP and CSP so there is nothing new to report there except that we will very soon be transitioning into the implementation phase on many of these new contracts as weather and harvest allow. We will also continue to take EQIP sign-ups for fiscal year 2021 applications until Friday November 20<sup>th</sup> 2020.

Blair, Tekamah and Dakota City remain in Phase 1 of the USDA Covid-19 Office re-opening status, Walthill remains in the gated phase.

# Non-Discrimination Statement
