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## A. <u>INFORMATION/EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS</u>:

The Papio NRD worked closely with the National Weather Service Omaha Office and other emergency management agencies to provide collaborative and consistent messaging regarding river ice conditions to the news media and public. With so many agencies involved, it's difficult for the media and public to know where to quickly go to get the latest information on ice jams and/or flooding. We created one central online location (Papio NRD website) that curated latest updates and provided helpful resource links. We look to further expand on this collaboration next season.

The meeting began at 10:00 am.

- 1. Introductions
  - An agenda was distributed via email. Marlin Petermann (P-MRNRD) facilitated introductions.
- 2. Proposed Stream Setback Policy Discussion FHU
  - Lori Laster (P-MRNRD) and Aaron Hirsh (FHU) presented the reasons for updating the stream setback policy, the stream degradation analysis, and the proposed policy The recommended policy is to incorporate a future degradation depth into the existing 3:1+50 ft policy. This depth is calculated as the difference between the existing stream slope and the assumed future stable slope of 0.15%. This will still allow for the installation of grade control structures to lessen the setback width if feasible and/or desired. The policy also calls for grade control to be installed with arterial road crossings and utility crossings.
  - Lori then opened discussion. The following questions were submitted via Zoom chat:
    - E&A Consulting: Would the new policy apply to Waters of the U.S. only? Or what is proposed? <u>A:The</u> setbacks would be applicable to any watercourse draining more than 40 acres.
    - Matt Vanick: What biological analysis was conducted as part of this study? Will aquatic fauna migration be factored in to the design standards for grade control

















- structures? A: The current study only focused on stream morphology. In future steps the Partnership will work to develop design standards that meet all requirements as required for permitting these structures in jurisdictional waters.
- Mike McIntosh: Will there still be an option to reduce or waive the required setbacks using engineered stabilized stream banks? A: Yes, if an analysis/design shows the design will stabilize the streams the setbacks may be waived.
- Jim Theiler: One of the biggest concerns that we need to understand a little better is how much additional land could this take out of development and off the tax rolls.
   A: The technical memorandum did provide an approximate value of land required to be placed in setbacks based on some assumptions.
- Mike McIntosh: Are there stakeholder meetings or outreach planned with the development community or are you looking to us to inform our clients and provide any feedback received? A: This presentation, the technical memorandum explaining the study and setback policy, and the recording of this meeting will all be posted at <a href="http://papiopartnership.org/stream-setback/">http://papiopartnership.org/stream-setback/</a> along with a comment form. We will hold another meeting in March and make sure that development stakeholders are notified of that meeting.
- Caleb Beasley: This policy will encourage developers to install grade stabilization structures. Have there been any conversations with Corps regarding permitting for these structures because these can be difficult or time consuming to permit and may not be able to permitted with a nationwide permit? A: Part of our next steps is to develop design guidelines for grade stabilization projects that would be able to fall into a nationwide permit category.
- Other comments included a desire to stay at 3:1+20 feet for smaller streams.
- Marlin Petermann noted that the NRD/FHU have also coordinated this policy development with the Southern Sarpy Watershed Partnership to try to keep a consistent policy throughout the area.
