PAPIO-MISSOURI RIVER NRD STAFF ASSIST NEBRASKA FOREST SERVICE WITH PRESCRIBED BURN



Blair Field Office NRD employees assisted the Nebraska Forest Service for a prescribed burn in Douglas County on April 15th, 2021. Sixteen acres of prairie grasses adjacent to Bennington High School were safely burned. Three NRD employees along with four Nebraska Forest Service staff members and three volunteers from Pheasants Forever monitored and safely maintained the burn for 3 hours.

Prescribed burns improve soil health, control weeds and trees in pastures and CRP land, improve forage quality and aid in regeneration. This particular prairie was being overtaken by weeds and volunteer trees.

In the weeks and months to come, this prairie will once again come alive with healthy and lush native grasses. If you're in the area, drive by and note the progress!
