May 11, 2023

## A. INFORMATION/EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS:

While it was a bit chilly, Earth Day Omaha still took place at Elmwood Park. The Papio NRD has been a proud sponsor of the event for many years. Thank you to Director Thompson for presenting the winners of the Friend of the Environment awards, whose efforts are making an amazing difference in supporting a sustainable future.

## B. PERSONNEL/MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS:

- 1. I worked with Congressman Mike Flood to submit a Community Project Funding request for a pump station at Offutt Air Force Base. The Congressman sent the District a letter informing us that the House Appropriations Committee has confirmed receipt of the request and that his office will keep us updated on the funding request. This project will be instrumental in removing excess floodwater to protect the base's vital infrastructure, sensitive national security assets and areas of affordable housing. The letter is attached.
- 2. We received a letter from the City of Fort Calhoun thanking the Papio NRD for giving Fort Calhoun the opportunity to participate in the District's Trail Assistance Program. The \$77,100 grant will go towards the Fort Calhoun Adams Park Trail project, enabling the city to continue to complete segments of its master trail plan. A copy of the letter is attached.
- 3. Thanks to Ian Ghanavati, we have a great time lapse video of Papio NRD staff fast at work completing a trial installation of the BNSF railroad closure structure located south of US Highway 370. In response to a flood emergency event, the closure structure will be installed to help prevent riverine flooding from the Missouri River from impacting nearby critical infrastructure. The closure structure design and construction are part of the ongoing R-613 and R-616-613 Federal Levee Improvement Project and will allow for a faster response to flood emergencies.

Meeting Minutes April 27, 2023 – 10:00 AM

The meeting began at 10:02 am.

- 1. Introductions
  - Lori Laster (Papio NRD) facilitated introductions.
- 2. Stream Degradation Study Final Presentation FHU
  - Dave Lampe with FHU summarized the work completed to help support the updates to the stream setback policy. Based on historical data of stream degradation, a stable slope was developed. Then the difference between the existing condition of the stream bed was compared to the stable slope to determine future potential degradation. The policy then recommended that the setbacks be calculated on the projected slope. Grade control could be constructed to help lessen the setback requirement.
  - Additional analysis was completed to determine the lateral migration of streams based on the same data set used for the degradation analysis. This showed that streams widened up to 10 feet from 2004 to 2016 in areas with minimal development. As development moves in to this area, even larger increases could be expected.
  - FHU's data will be summarized and used during the plan and policy update effort over the next year.
- 3. 2024 Implementation Plan, Watershed Management Plan, and Interlocal Agreement
  - Lori Laster stated that the Papio NRD Board of Directors chose Houston Engineering for the plan update project. Papio NRD staff will work to negotiate a contract for approval at the May 11, 2023 Board Meeting.
  - The Partnership will be required to vote to approve the contract at the May 25, 2023 meeting as the funds for this study come from the Partnership Fund.
- 4. Next Meeting Date
  - The next meeting is scheduled for May 25, 2023 at 10 am.
- 7. Adjourn
  - The meeting adjourned at 10:29 am. An agenda and the emailed handouts are available upon request.
