Envirothon tests students on their knowledge of seven natural resources topics. Congrats to students from Concordia Junior-Senior High School for qualifying for state in April.

B. PERSONNEL/MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS:

- 1. We have several new hires. Corey Mackling was hired on February 26th as the Thurston County Rural Water Supply Operator/Maintenance Technician. William Jewell was hired on March 4th as the Park Department's Land Steward. Kaden Kneifl was hired on March 5th as the District Field Representative working out of the Dakota City office. Marty Thieman is back with the District! Marty was hired on February 27th as the Park Department's temporary Groundskeeper.
- 2. The District's Workers Compensation Experience Rating again came in under 1%, with an Experience Modification Rating (EMR) of .77. An EMR of 1% is the industry average of employers in our state in the same industry. The District's low rating reduces our renewal premiums for workers' compensation insurance. A summary report is attached.
- 3. The Papillion Creek Watershed Partnership is holding three virtual briefings this month for elected officials and county and city administrators to learn more about the Partnership and its upcoming agreement. Those involved in the Partnership are renewing their commitment for the 6th time to tackle water quality and flooding concerns in the metro area. A flyer is attached.
- 4. The District hosted a "Careers in the Field" Trip for Westview High sophomores interested in pursuing a career in civil & community engineering & environmental studies. Several on our staff talked about their jobs, backgrounds, education, day-to-day duties, etc., to give the students first-hand insight and advice. Meeting Minutes February 28, 2024

The meeting began at 10:02 am.

- 1. Introductions
 - a. Lori Laster (Papio NRD) facilitated introductions.
- 2. Interlocal Agreement and Stormwater Policies
 - a. Lori Laster reviewed the draft interlocal agreement for continuation of the Partnership. There are only a few clean up items in the draft agreement. No major changes are proposed at this time.
 - b. The Partnership Dues have been recalculated based on population and extra-territorial jurisdiction boundaries. The NRD will continue to contribute \$90,000 each year.
 - c. The Partnership has been working towards an updated stream setback policy for several years. A policy proposal was presented in 2021 and there was a lot of push back from development stakeholders. Since then, the Partnership has worked to resolve some of the issues presented with the 2021 policy. A revised policy was presented to MOBA in 2023. They are still opposed to the update.
 - d. Without support from development stakeholders, the Partners feel that an updated policy is unlikely to be adopted by Councils and Boards.
 - e. The consensus of the group is to move forward with adoption of the interlocal agreement without the updated stream setback policy.
 - f. MOBA has indicated they are willing to work with the Partnership to find a policy that will work for all groups. This work will continue with the goal of an updated policy prior to the expiration of the interlocal agreement in 2029.

Elected Official Outreach

- a. It has been several years since the Partnership has had direct engagement with elected officials and city/county administrators. Because many people are not familiar with the Partnership this is an opportune time to have some informational sessions.
- b. Three virtual briefings have been scheduled for March 25, March 27, and March 28. Each Partner needs to provide a list to the NRD of people who should be invited to attend the briefings. Each one will have the same presentation with a time for questions and answers.



- 4. Other Items of Interest
 - a. No other items of interest were noted.
- 5. Next Meeting Date
 - a. The next regular meeting is scheduled March 28, 2024.
- 6. Adjourn
 - a. The meeting adjourned at 10:43 am.

Meeting Minutes February 7, 2024

Attendees: See attached sign in sheet

- 1. The meeting began at ~10:00 am.
- 2. Introductions
 - a. Ian Ghanavati (Papio NRD) facilitated introductions. 9 attendees were present (see attached sign in sheet).
- 3. 2024 Interlocal Agreement Comments
 - a. The 2024 Interlocal Agreement was sent out to the Partnership members a month prior.
 - b. Overall changes to the Agreement's language are minor, with the substantial changes being the inclusion of the Watershed Management Plan and Implementation Plan as well as updated funding allocations. The language and setup is very similar to the Papillion Creek Watershed Partnership's current agreement.
 - i. Some changes were made by Papio NRD legal counsel concerning termination of the agreement and how a tie is handled in the executive committee's votes. No comments by the Partners on these changes.
 - c. The policy language was reviewed and the it was confirmed that the final language for stream setbacks allows for a 15 foot overlap with utility easements as approved by the local jurisdiction.
 - d. The interlocal will be updated and sent out for review by respective Partner legal counsels. Comments are due back February 23, 2024, to be incorporated prior to the following meeting.
 - e. The point was clarified that the municipal code and/or regulations of each individual Partner jurisdiction must be updated in addition to adopting the Interlocal Agreement.



4. Watershed Policies Effective Adoption Date

- a. The Interlocal Agreement will become effective on July 1, 2024. A question was posed to the Partnership of when the policies would be enforced, with three alternatives identified:
 - Updated policies effective at the time of adoption of the Interlocal Agreement (July 1, 2024)
 - ii. Updated policies effective at a subsequent date, TBD, to allow a grace period for existing projects.
 - iii. Updated policies to be optional for grace period, so that new projects could choose to adhere to the existing or the updated policies. The updated policies would become mandatory at a future date, TBD.
- b. The Partnership determined that based on the results of the outreach already conducted and the plan to have the Interlocal Agreement brought to each jurisdiction's council by April/May, a sufficient grace period has already been established. The updated watershed policies will become effective on July 1, 2024.

5. Guidance Document Update

a. Ian Ghanavati and Lori Laster (Papio NRD) and Sara Mechtenberg (Houston Engineering) gave an update on the Grade Control Guidance Document advisory meeting that was held with development engineers. The main concern is permitting and some additional hydrology data was requested in the meeting which will be added to the guidance document.

6. Next Meeting: Thursday March 7th

- a. The next Partnership meeting will be held on March 7, 2024. The Partnership will vote on adoption of the Interlocal and its exhibits.
- 7. The meeting ended at ~10:36 am.
