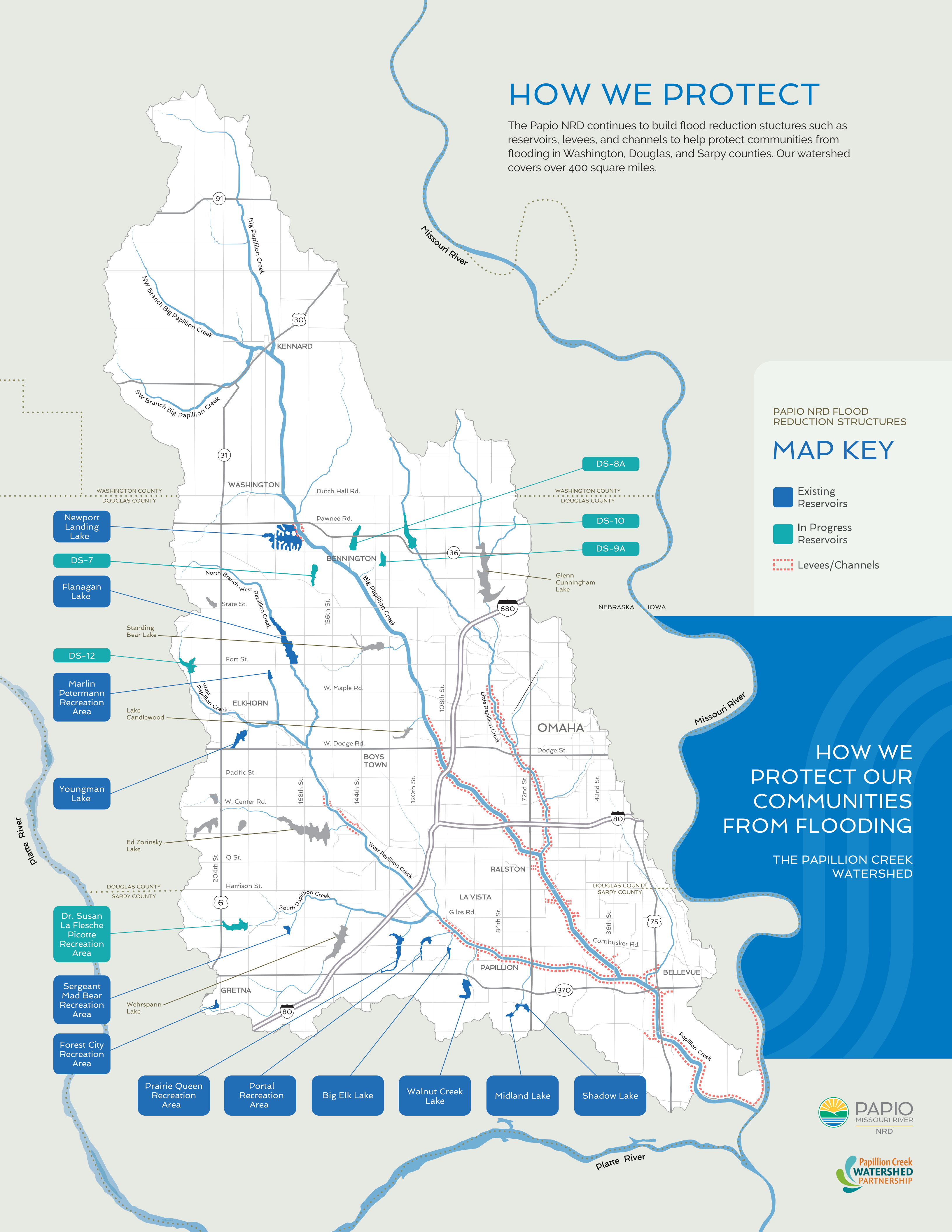
PAPIO NRD FLOOD

- Levees/Channels

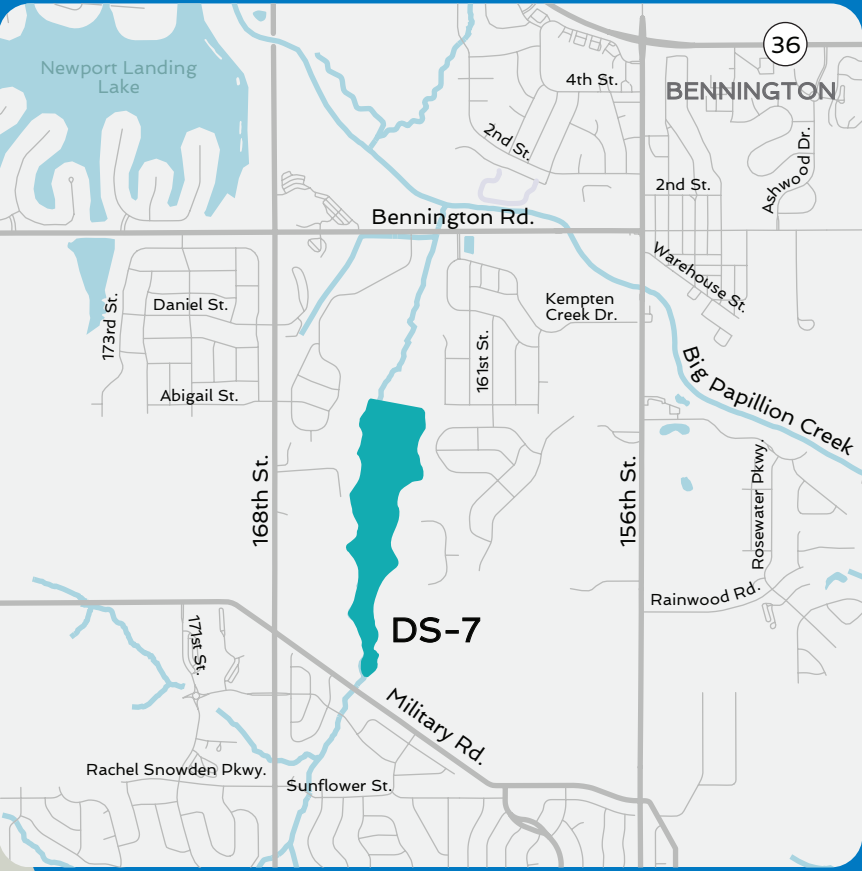

WATERSHED

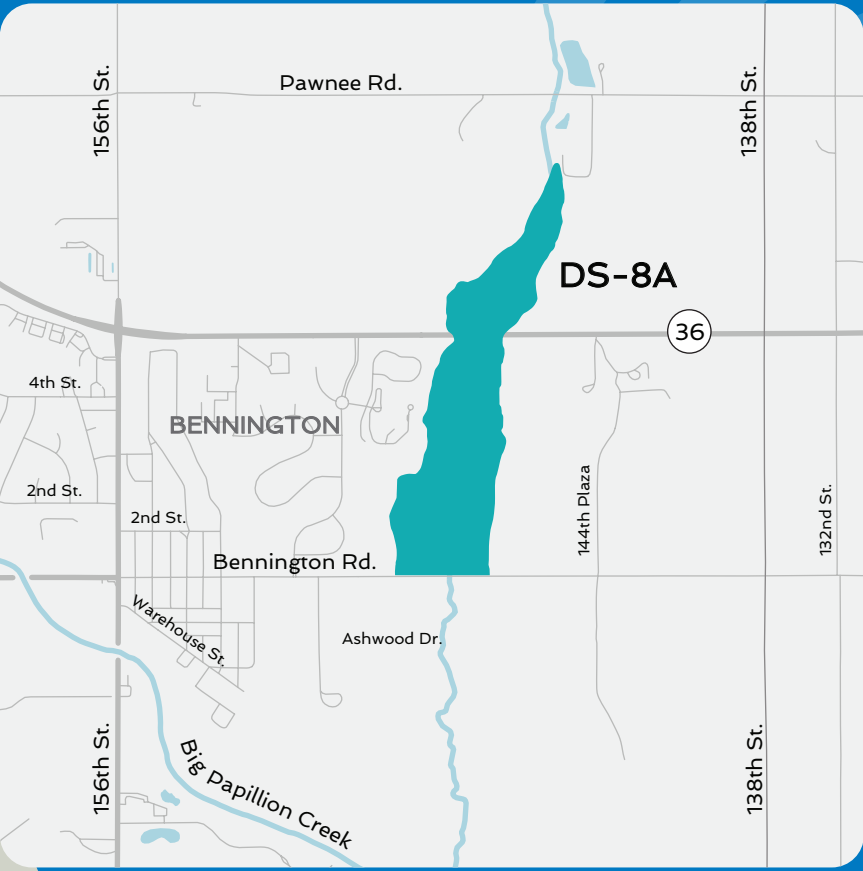


PAPILLION CREEK WATERSHED PAPIO NRD FLOOD REDUCTION RESERVOIRS

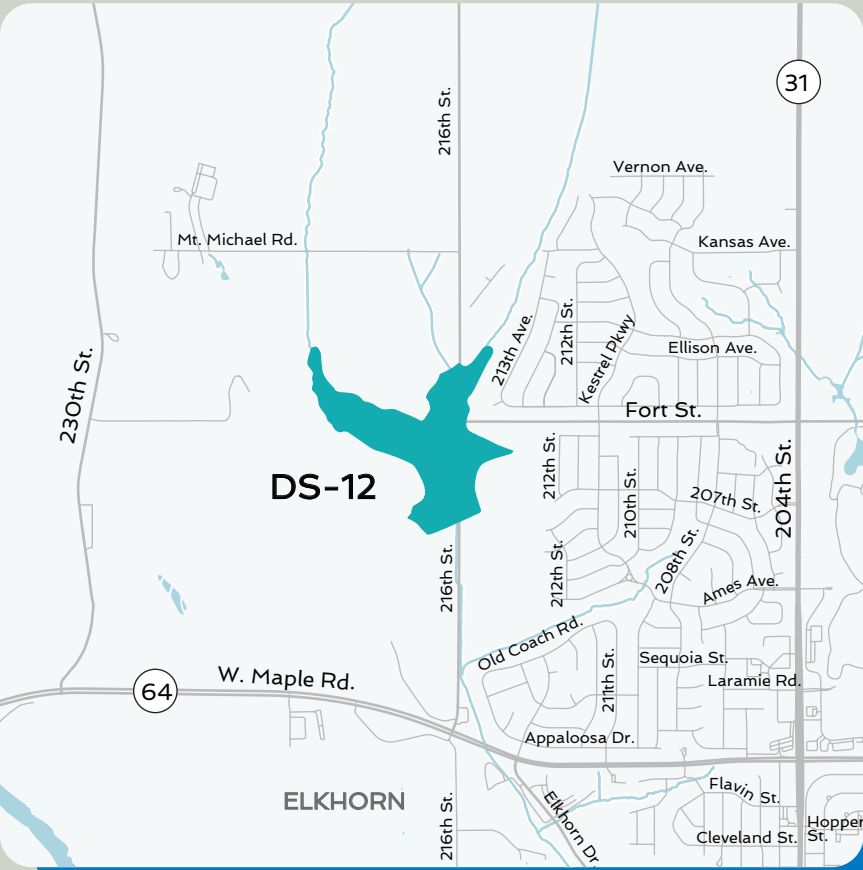

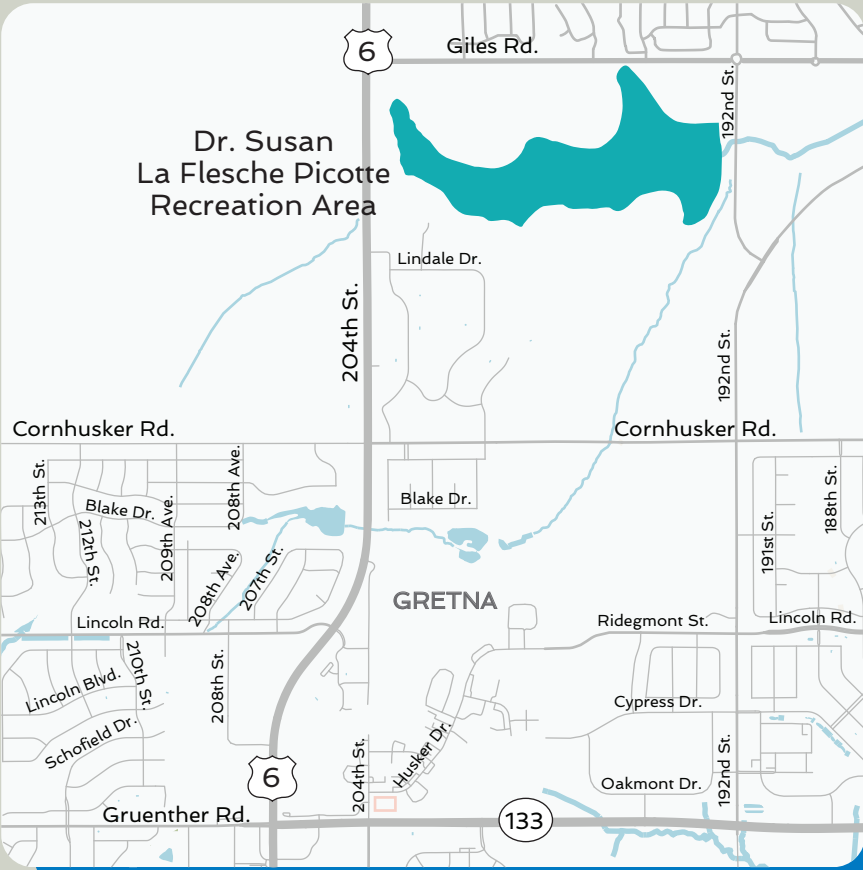
