MONTHLY UPDATE

August 2011

A Partnership meeting was held on August 25, 2011. Minutes are updated regularly on the Partnership's website:

www.papiopartnership.org.



Douglas County and Omaha have already executed the draft MOU. La Vista had met with Sarpy County and is in the process of trying to finalize the agreement. Each community will execute a separate agreement with Sarpy County in order to be able to reference city codes. The agreement is with Sarpy County legal counsel for final approval. Upon approval of the agreement from legal counsel, the agreement will be presented to City Councils and the County Board for final approval.

Although Gretna is not designated as a MS4 community, they will execute an agreement to have in place at such time as they are designated. The City of Bennington is also looking into a similar agreement with Douglas County.

Amendment to Stormwater Management Plan for MS4 Permit

Due to Missouri River flooding over the summer, City of Omaha staff have been diverted from regular duties to assist in flood fighting activities. Therefore the BMP monitoring activities the City performs on behalf of the Partnership as required in the stormwater management plan have not been completed this year as anticipated. The City of Omaha has presented a draft amendment of the stormwater management plan to NDEQ for consideration. Once NDEQ has reviewed and approved the amendment, other communities may need to amend their plans as well. Omaha anticipates a



response from NDEQ in September and will report back at the next meeting.

Semiannual Report Due October 1, 2011

The semiannual report to NDEQ on activities listed in the stormwater management plan is due October 1, 2011. A template will be prepared and emailed to everyone prior to the next meeting.

Other Items of Interest

- EPA has delayed the issuance of numeric effluent limitation guidelines in the NPDES construction stormwater general permit. At this time, there is no indication that limit will be issued prior to the Nebraska permit expiring on December 31, 2012.
- The Partnership has not yet been notified if the EPA Wetland Program
 Development Grant application was successful. The notification should be received by the end of August.
- Applications for LB 1226 Stormwater Funding are due September 30, 2011.

NRD Board sets budget with no property tax levy increase for fifth consecutive year

At its August 12th meeting, the Papio-Missouri River Natural Resources District Board of Directors adopted a Fiscal Year 2012 general operating budget that once again calls for no tax levy increase. "This is the fifth consecutive year that the NRD has held steady or reduced its property tax levy," said John Winkler, NRD General Manager. "This is being proposed despite the elimination of a half million dollars in state aid to the NRD and the historic Missouri River flood fight in which NRD levees are protecting Offutt Air Force Base, portions of Bellevue and Omaha's Papillion Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant," he said.

Considerable NRD financial and staff resources are being utilized to protect these facilities that are of national and statewide importance. The levees have been bolstered and are being constantly monitored.

The proposed budget calls for a FY 2012 property tax levy of .032753, the same as the current FY 2011 tax levy. This levy would mean that the owner of property valued at \$100,000 would pay a total of \$32.75 in property taxes next year to support NRD projects and programs. The levy is based on an estimated .5 percent increase in valuations across the District. The Papio-Missouri River NRD area includes all of Sarpy, Douglas, Washington and Dakota Counties plus the eastern 60% of Burt and Thurston Counties.

The budget outlines total spending estimated at \$82.3 million. Of this amount, 16.8 million in revenue will be raised through the property tax levy. NRD revenue includes the tax levy, bonds, federal and state cost sharing for specific projects and income from Improvement Project Areas.

"We are able to meet the public safety needs in our area while keeping our programs effective and our employee requirements and benefits at a reasonable level. Our staff is health conscious, resulting in only small increases in our health insurance needs over the last few years," said Winkler.

The NRD Board of Directors will formally set the tax levy requirement at its September meeting after district-wide valuation increases are confirmed.

Nebraska's state park areas are outdoor recreation magnets.

The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission's eight state parks, 66 recreation areas and 10 state historical parks hosted 8.7 million visits last year.

Whether you live in metropolitan Omaha and Lincoln, or in a remote Panhandle village, you're not far from places to fish, hunt, camp, boat, paddle, hike, bike or picnic — and not just at Game and Parks sites.

Several of Nebraska's natural resources districts opened or reopened recreation areas this summer. They complement the Game and Parks sites.

Districts with new or renovated areas include Little Blue, Lower Big Blue, Lower Elkhorn, Nemaha and Upper Big Blue. The areas offer a variety of outdoor recreation activities, including fishing, hiking and camping.

Natural resources districts are local government entities with broad responsibilities to protect water, soil and wildlife.

When an NRD builds a dam or other flood-control structure to protect lives and property, it also provides opportunities for outdoor recreation, enhances wildlife habitat, renovates wetlands and prevents soil erosion, said Mary Ann Worthmann of Crofton, president of the Nebraska Association of Resources Districts.

In the Omaha area, the Papio-Missouri River NRD operates several recreation areas, including Chalco Hills, Heron Haven, Prairie View Recreation Area, bicycle trails and Platte and Elkhorn river public access parks.

This year's new or renovated NRD recreation areas and their features:

- Little Blue NRD: Liberty Cove recreation area near Lawrence and Lone Star recreation area near Strang now feature new camper pads. Both recreation areas offer fishing and camping. Liberty Cove has 1.4 miles of walking trail around the lake. Lone Star also has a walking trail.
- Lower Big Blue NRD: The Big Indian Lake Recreation Area improvement project near Odell has been completed and the recreation area reopened in June. New features include an emergency helipad, three sediment dikes, four maintenance breakwaters, nine in-lake breakwaters and fish shoals and scallops. Visitors will notice improved shoreline stabilization, improved access, a new boat ramp, boat dock, handicap-accessible restroom, additional and improved camping areas and a new beach with the swimming cove protected by breakwaters.
- Lower Elkhorn NRD: The new Maple Creek Recreation Area near Leigh opened in May. The 160-acre reservoir's primary purpose is flood protection for Leigh, downstream bridges and landowners along the west fork of Maple Creek. The reservoir is divided into two parts by Nebraska Highway 91, which was raised to create a sediment retention/wetland area to provide good water quality and extend the life of the reservoir. The recreation area includes camper pads, a swimming beach, a walking/biking trail, fishing, boating (5 mph, no wake) and picnic shelters.
- Nemaha NRD: At Iron Horse Trail Lake near DuBois, renovations included tree clearing, sediment removal and construction of sediment traps to slow the movement of new sediment into the lake. Fishing won't be available until newly stocked fish reach catchable size in a few years. The renovation includes improved fish habitat, fishing access points with a handicapped-accessible pier, a boat mooring island near the beach and walking trails. The NRD also added 11 electrical camping hookups and developed a new, primitive recreational vehicle and tent camping area.
- Upper Big Blue NRD: Recharge Lake near York has 12 new camping pads, an RV dump station, a refurbished day-use area, dedicated tent camping area, outdoor amphitheater with tiered-seating, new restrooms, two new picnic shelters with tables, cooking grills and fire rings. Landscaping was added and new trees planted. The site already had hiking and biking trails, playground equipment, boat dock and boat ramp.

A new interactive website for all of Nebraska's NRD recreation areas allows searches of dozens of areas perfect for camping, fishing, picnics, hiking, biking, wildlife viewing and more — even the availability of restrooms. The site is www.nrdrec.org.
