Adoption Of Agenda

> It was moved by Director Schwope and seconded by Director Conley that the agenda be adopted.

Roll call was taken on the motion. The motion carried on a vote of 5-0.

<u>Proof Of Publication</u>: Public notice of the meeting was posted at all District offices and published in the Omaha World-Herald on February 5, 2009. The Chairperson ordered the Proof of Publication recorded in the minutes of this meeting.

<u>Changes to the P-MRNRD Wage and Salary Administration Program</u>: General Manager, John Winkler, introduced Roxanne Krasno, Silverstone Group, who presented Silverstone's recommendations for changes to the district's Wage and Salary Administration Program. She told the subcommittee that the recommendations were presented to the NRD staff at an All Employees meeting and that feedback was received.

• It was moved by Director Schwope and seconded by Director Thompson that the proposed changes to the Wage and Salary Administration Program, as presented, be adopted by the full Board of Directors.

Roll call was taken on the motion. The motion carried on a vote of 4-0.

<u>Amendments to Policy 16.4 District Policy – Nebraska Clean Air Act Designations</u>: GM John Winkler reviewed the proposed changes to the policy. He noted that amendment would prohibit the use of all tobacco products in District buildings, vehicles and equipment. Following is an amended policy:

16.4 District Property - Nebraska Clean Air Act Designations. Smoking Use of tobacco products is prohibited in all District buildings, and signs advising of this prohibition shall be posted by Management at all outside entrances to all District buildings, such signs to read as follows: stations: "Smoking Use of tobacco products is not permitted in this building." Smoking Use of tobacco products also is prohibited in any all District vehicles and equipment, if accompanied by a non smoker, and signs advising of this prohibition shall be posted by Management in all District vehicles and equipment, such signs to read as follows: "Use of tobacco products is not permitted in this vehicle/equipment." [December 10, 1987; May 9, 1991; March 12, 2009]

There was discussion as to the need for such a policy change.

Director John Conley suggested that the Subcommittee consider the following wording of the policy:

The use of tobacco products is prohibited in all District buildings, motorized equipment with cabs and vehicles. Additionally, the use of tobacco products is prohibited in proximity to all building entrance doors, air intakes, windows which can be opened and other such locations as prescribed by law and regulations. Appropriate signs shall be posted as required by law and regulations.

• It was moved by Director Japp that the policy, as stated by Director John Conley, be adopted. The motion died due to lack of a second.

No action is recommended by the subcommittee

Legislative Bills:

a. <u>LB 134</u>: General Manager, John Winkler, briefed the subcommittee on LB 134. This bill would limit an NRDs Eminent Domain authority. The primary motivation for the bill is to limit the Lower Platte South NRDs potential use of Eminent Domain to construct portions of the MoPac Trail between Omaha and Lincoln. It was also noted that Eminent Domain is required in some instances – such as the purchase of land from an NRD Board Member.

• It was moved by Director Thompson and seconded by Director Schwope that the subcommittee recommend to the full Board of Directors that the Papio Missouri River Natural Resources District oppose LB 134, and that the General Manager and the District's Government Relations Consultant be directed to take appropriate action to obtain indefinite postponement of this bill in the Natural Resources Committee or killing of the bill by the full legislature..

Roll call was taken on the motion. The motion carried on a vote of 4-1.

b. <u>LB577</u>: General Manager, John Winkler, briefed the subcommittee on this bill that would change provisions relating to Improvement Project Areas for NRDs. P-MRNRD attorney, Paul Peters, indicated that the new provisions in this bill would make the creation of Improvement Project Areas, especially for flood control projects, very difficult.

• It was moved by Director Thompson and seconded by Director Schwope that the subcommittee recommend to the full Board of Directors that the Papio Missouri River Natural Resources District oppose LB 577, and that the General Manager and Government Relations Consultant be directed to take appropriate action to obtain indefinite postponement of this bill in the Natural Resources Committee or killing of the bill by the full legislature.

Roll call was taken on the motion. The motion carried on a vote of 4-1.
