### **REVIEW OF FY 2008 DRAFT BUDGET:**

GM Winkler reviewed the draft budget summary fact sheet and his June 8, 2007 memo. Mr. Winkler noted several budget items; general administration expenses were down from last year, several program budgets were increased from last year, the budget is adequately funded,

necessary cash reserves are identified and accounted for and the property tax mill levy will be reduced next fiscal year. Several questions were raised regarding the need for a "Strategic Plan" to accompany the budget, the cash reserve account for Papio Reservoirs. He noted that this was the first review of the draft budget and that there were still several unknowns to be addressed such as final revenues and expenditures, treasurers' balance, valuations, cash on hand, etc.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH HAWKINS CONSTRUCTION CO., NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF ROADS AND THE P-MRNRD FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENT PROJECT WITHIN THE LOWER PLATTE RIVER WATERSHED: GM Winkler reported that Hawkins Construction Co and the Nebraska Department of Roads recently entered into a settlement agreement with the Environmental Protection Agency which would resolve environmental allegations made by EPA concerning construction of the I-80 bridge crossing the Platte River near Mahoney State Park. One of the components of the settlement is the acquisition of conservation easements along the Platte River in the Schramm Park area. The MOU would allow the District to participate directly in this effort. The MOU holds minimal risk to the District and allows us to recover any administrative expenses from participating in the project from settlement funds.

Mr. Cleveland explained the primary reason for this budget item exceeding 110% was a billing error made by one of the District's vendors in which a debt was incurred in one fiscal year instead of divided over two fiscal years.

Paul Woodward then explained that West Papio Regional Detention Basin (No. 5) was originally proposed in response to increases in flooding within the West Papio watershed as determined by preliminary hydrology and hydraulics for the West Papillion Creek floodplain remapping. He noted that technical analysis showed that this basin in addition to 2 other basins directly east of WP-RB 5 would provide a tremendous benefit in reducing some of the increased 100 and 500 year flood flows. Woodward indicated that the reason this property was being considered for purchase was simply to prevent if from being platted and developed as originally proposed in the Pink Industrial Park 2 Preliminary Plat. This similar situation was encountered about 1 year ago when the District purchased land just east of Bennington to preserve Dam Site 8A.

- ❖ It was moved by Director John Conley and seconded by Director Fowler that the Subcommittee recommend to the Board that the General Manager be authorized to negotiate an agreement for the purchase by the District from Pink Family Investments LLC of approximately 11.86 acres of land in Pink Industrial Park 2, necessary for the emergency spillway for the proposed South Papillion Creek detention structure, for the price of \$35,000 per acre, and for the purchase of necessary easements for the gross price of \$3,500, such agreement to contain such other terms and conditions as the General Manager determines necessary and Legal Counsel approves as to form.
